



Get sponsored!



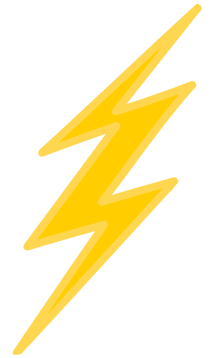
There are lots of ways your pupils can get involved and be heroes against homelessness.

Here are a few suggestions for sponsored activities that can raise valuable funds to support Porchlight's work:

Sponsored spell

This is a great way for your pupils to learn and think about the themes associated with homelessness while developing their literacy skills.

Cardboard sleep out

This popular activity is an ideal way for children to experience what it's like to be homeless in a safe environment. You can choose to hold a cardboard sleep out in the grounds of the school or your school hall, overnight or simply for a morning or afternoon.



Building cardboard shelters contributes to the design technology curriculum, while the activity itself broadens children's horizons and develops courageous advocacy.
